Thank you for your interest in our job vacancy. We're delighted that you are considering joining the committed and passionate team at LWCA. I enclose an application form, job description and other information about Leeds Weekend Care Association (LWCA).

LWCA started Weekenders Club in June 1998 as a small pilot scheme, funded and managed by Scope – the organisation for people with cerebral palsy. After its pilot year, the project became independent of Scope and is now a separate Charity and Company, managed by a voluntary management committee. Weekenders Club is a successful and well-established disability childcare provision, which operates 47 Saturdays per year and is based at The Vinery, 20 Vinery Terrace, East End Park, Leeds, LS9 9LU.

Please note that our scheme operates on Saturdays and, as a result, you must be happy and willing to work weekends.

Enclosed is a copy of our eligibility criteria for places on the schemes, which outlines some of the difficulties our children and young people present. We receive referrals from social care or as self-referrals from parent(s)/carer(s); with priority given to children whose carers do not have other respite breaks. Children who come to Weekenders Club attend one session every 4 weeks. The groups are fixed but vary slightly in numbers attending (approximately 15 per session). The emphasis of Weekenders Club is on **play** and **fun**.

Experience of working with children and young people with special needs is essential. All our staff will be required to undergo an enhanced DBS disclosure.

I hope this provides you with some information about our charity and the services we provide.

Leeds Weekend Care Association is committed to the provision of a high quality and appropriate service which meets the needs of carers and promotes the development of children with disabilities. As an organization we are committed to safeguarding the children and young people under our care.

### MAIN DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. To work under the direction of the Manager/Senior Play Leader, delivering fun play activities for small groups of children, of mixed ages and abilities, on and off the site.
- 2. To provide fun and stimulating activities for children with a wide range of abilities and disabilities who attend the scheme for 1 session every 4 weeks.
- 3. An understanding of and commitment to our safeguarding.
- 4. To meet users' personal care needs.
- 5. To maintain a supportive relationship with parent(s) / carer(s).
- 6. To assist Senior Play Leader and Manager in keeping of records.
- 7. To assist in tidying of building and equipment at the end of each play session.
- 8. To check that equipment being used is safe and to report any defects to the Play Leader.
- 9. To undertake all other tasks within the remit of the job, which may be required from time to time.
- 10. All LWCA staff are required to hold an enhanced DBS disclosure, which we will apply for.
- 11. To attend all mandatory training provided, within the appropriate time scale.

Staff are expected to comply with and maintain records in accordance with the policies and procedures of the Leeds Weekend Care Association.

The job description will be kept under review to ensure it remains up to date.

The jobholder will be consulted about any proposed changes.

## DETAILED CRITERIA FOR ELIGIBILITY FOR WEEKENDERS CLUB SCHEME.

Children/Young People are eligible if they come within either of or a combination of these headings.

### 1. Complex Care Needs.

- Needs almost constant attention medical or otherwise
- Complicated feeding arrangements
- Invasive medical treatments (not necessarily frequent)
- Carers under pressure/stress, e.g. large family, single parent, siblings with disabilities.
- Carers ill-health (temporary or otherwise)
- Demanding personal care needs, e.g. hoist toileting, incontinence.

## 2. Physical Disability.

- Any child/young person with cerebral palsy.
- Conditions which restrict or impede mobility.
- Sensory impairments which impede learning and social skills.
- Other physical conditions such as hydrocephalus, spina bifida, muscular dystrophy, epilepsy etc.

## 3. Learning Disability.

#### Severe

- Communication greatly limited (no verbal communication or comprehension).
- Little social skills
- Behaviour, which is extremely challenging, disruptive, or destructive.
- Little independent play skills

#### Moderate

- Limited communication skills able to converse, follow simple instructions.
- Social skills impaired.
- · Behaviour difficult at times.
- Able to play with supervision.
- Not independent.
- Learning difficulties associated with the child's diagnosis.
